It has come to our recent attention that the Murrieta Unified School District will not accept any high school credits earned by students in any homeschool program. I have reached out to HSLDA and their lawyers have confirmed that even though it is legal to homeschool in California, each school district has the right to accept or reject credits obtained while homeschooling. If your student/s ever transfer to public high school in or out of the state, this could become a problem. This is one reason why keeping records is so important so you can show/prove everything your student has done while schooling at home.

By signing this form, you understand the risk you take if you decide to transfer your student/s to public high school (this does not apply to elementary and middle school as there are no credits received). You acknowledge and understand that even by keeping student records current and complete, and following the guidelines for the State of California high school graduation requirements, any public school you transfer to may reject your student/s' credits earned while homeschooling.
